ENTRANCE/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:					
(Programs of four hundred fifty (450) or more clock hours or the credit hour equivalent shall administer a basic skills examination to each student who enrolls, unless the student has provided evidence of a high school graduation diploma, general equivalency diploma, or its equivalent.)					
Students must be at least (16) sixteen years of age and have proof of education or pass the (TABE) Test of Adult Basic Education with a minimum score of 70% on all sections to enroll at UR Beauty & Barber Academy. Students having a high school diploma or GED do not have to take the (TABE) Test of Adult Basic Education. Students may enroll at any time. The attendance clock hours, assignments, and exam scores will determine completion of the program. Students under the age of (18) will need consent from a legal guardian.					
PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:					
The objective of the Barbering program is to teach and prepare students for the state examination. After completing the necessary clock hours and services, the students will receive the diploma and will be registered to take the state exam to become a licensed Barber and enter the workforce in an entry level position.					
PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:					
The Barbering program is designed to train students in cutting, shaving, facials, and hair modification. Hair modifications include but are not limited to washing, cutting, styling, coloring, and straightening of hair. Other topics to be covered in this program include communication skills, human relations, infection controls, HIV/AIDS, and business ethics. Registration for licensure in the State of Florida will be sent after completion of clock hours and services.					
EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE:					
While UR Beauty & Barber Academy cannot guarantee employment for graduates, assistance in finding employment is provided by posting area job openings on a career opportunities bulletin board for students to review. Students also receive training in professionalism and job search skills including how to write a resume, complete an employment application, and prepare for an effective interview. The curriculum places a great deal of emphasis on how to obtain and retain employment after graduation. Graduates are encouraged to maintain contact with the school and follow up with the school on current employment or employment needs. In addition, the school maintains a network of relationships with professionals and employers who provide mentoring to students while they are in school. Job referrals are made known to interested graduates as available.					
GRADING PROCEDURES:					
Students are regularly given written and practical exams throughout the duration of the program. The minimum passing grade for this program is "C". All academic records are confidential and permanently archived at the school. UR Beauty & Barber Academy grading scales is as follows:

TEACHING METHODS

UR Beauty & Barber Academy utilizes a variety of teaching methods. Coursework from the book is taught through a combination of CIMA Milady's online method, visual teaching methods, including handouts, chalkboard, and notes; and lecturing on the subject material. Other assignments are given to students to utilize visual aspects of learning.

Hands-on training is utilized to teach students how to perform services on their clients. Instructors work with the students both one on one and in groups to demonstrate the proper way to perform services.

Students have access to a media center, including magazines, DVD's, and laptops with internet access to complete assignments or advance their own knowledge if they choose. Students also have access to a library of professional publications to utilize for assignments or for self-study.
